**MEDICATION REVIEW: A POWERFUL TOOL
FOR INTERPROFESSIONAL PATIENT CARE**

The **Transnational Educational Initiative** Future Leaders Summit of the *Global Alliance of Medical Excellence (GAME)* will be hosted in Bologna (Italy) by the Department of Medical and Surgical Sciences and will bring together medical and health students and Faculty from 8 partner universities across three continents to support international and interprofessional reflections on the appropriate management of pharmacological therapies in diverse clinical settings.

The **face-to-face TEI Future Leaders Summit in July 2026 will be a three-day forum** incorporating practical workshops in different teaching formats to enable our future clinicians to learn from each other and to work together to address global health issues.

By the end of the Summit, participants will:

- know what a medication review is and its importance for patient safety in clinical practice;
- understand how self-awareness affects communication and teamwork;
- recognise different roles and perspectives in a medication review;
- reflect on their own working style and its impact on others;
- envision how emerging health technologies may transform traditional communication and collaboration among healthcare professionals in prescribing;
- have practised collaborative decision-making in medication review in a safe role-play environment .

GETTING TO BOLOGNA

■ From Bologna Guglielmo Marconi Airport (BLQ)

Bologna city centre can be reached easily from the airport via the Marconi Express, a monorail service connecting the airport to Bologna Centrale railway station in approximately 7 minutes. Taxis are also available outside the terminal and typically take 20–30 minutes to reach the city centre, depending on traffic.

Bologna Centrale is the city's main railway station and is connected to all major Italian cities by high-speed trains. From the station, participants can reach the hotels and the venue by taxi, bus, or on foot (depending on the hotel).

The Hotel San Giorgio is located in Bologna's historic city centre, within walking distance of Bologna Centrale Station and major city attractions.

From Bologna Centrale Station take bus C from Bologna Centrale Station. The journey takes approximately 14 minutes. Alternatively, the hotel is within walking distance from the station (approximately 16 minutes on foot).

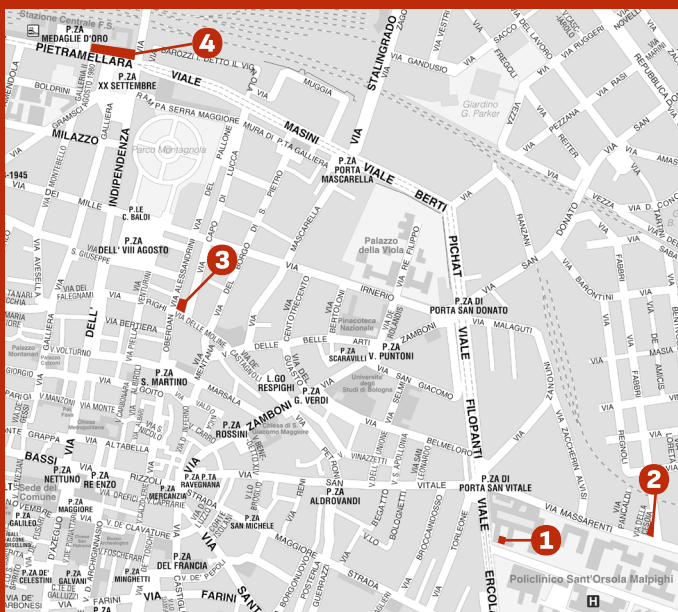
